GEA 7200 Philosophical, Psychological, Socio-Cultural and Anthropological Foundations of Education

This is a survey course describing the philosophical, psychological, social, and anthropological foundations bases of education. Covers the application of psychology to education, the determinants of behavior, how students learn, the transfer and management of learning, emotional, physical and social factors in learning and teacher-student relationships. It also examines the profession of teaching the diverse population with whom teachers work, and the impact of curriculum, technology and school organization on the classroom and the profession. (3 units)

GRR 7501 Statistical Methods Applied to Research

Fundamentals of statistics as applied to master's degree research, including population, sample, parameter, statistics, and variable; the branches of statistics, sources of data, sampling concepts, sample selection methods; analysis and interpretation of data using statistics software (3 units)

GRR 7502 Research Methods across Disciplines

Methods and designs, concepts, processes, tools and interpretation of results of research in different disciplines (3 units)

GC 2004 Principles and Techniques of Guidance

Integration and application of the concepts, principles and techniques of guidance (3 units)

GC 2005 Theories of Personality

Focuses on the theories of personality and development with emphasis on the roles of society and their implications to guidance particularly in the preventive aspect of maladjustment (3 units)

GC 2006 Organization and management of Guidance and Counseling Programs and Services

The major focus of this applied course is on the design, development, and implementation, and evaluation of a comprehensive school counseling program that meets national standards. (3 units)

GC 2007 Career Development and Counseling

Focuses on theories, approaches, and techniques on career development; it includes researches to career development focusing on the processes of choosing, preparing, entering and adjusting in a chosen career. Counselor-in-training will also be taught how to design a development program. (3 units)

GC 2008 Group Process and Program Development

Study on understanding group development, dynamics of group counseling methods and skills and various other group work approaches. (3 units)

GC 2009 Theories and Techniques of Counseling

Focuses on the theories, approaches and techniques of counseling and its applications to various counseling activities; it includes supervised practicum in the different settings. (3 units)

GC 2102A Internship in Guidance & Counseling (Part 1)

Supervised laboratory and field experiences in counseling and other guidance activities in the different settings – school, community hospital and industry; this course requires 20 hours a week for laboratory during the semester. (2 units)

GC 2102B Internship in Guidance & Counseling (Part 2)

Supervised laboratory and field experiences in counseling and other guidance activities in the different settings – school, community hospital and industry; this course requires 20 hours a week for laboratory during the semester. (2 units)

GC 2100 Measurement & Evaluation in Guidance and Counseling

An advanced course in group testing organized to acquaint counselors and other school personnel with the various types of standardized tests, with stress on scoring, computations, and interpretation procedures. (3 units)

GC 2101 Legal and Ethical Principles, Problems and Issues in Guidance and Counseling

This course introduces legal and ethical practices and principles for the school counselor. Emphasis will be placed on the legal and ethical issues school counselors will encounter with their diverse populations such as Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Individual Education mediation, consultation and collaboration, due process, confidentiality laws, family and student rights, counseling and Code of Ethics. (3 units)

GRR 7700 Comprehensive Examination

Prerequisite: Completion of all course work (0 units)

GRR 7980 Thesis 1

Selection and presentation of research topic, writing and oral defense of research proposal (3 units; Prerequisite: GRR 7700 Comprehensive Examinations)

GRR 7990 Thesis 2

Conducting, writing and oral defense of master's thesis approved in Thesis 1 (3 units; Prerequisite: GRR 7980 - Thesis 1)

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
